The atmosphere transforms as suona, guitar, and bass unite in 趙季平's evocative "龜茲舞," Prima's vibrant "Sing Sing Sing," and Corea's masterful "Spain."

Cal and Zoe's tap artistry gives physical form to rhythm, translating the Atlantic Five Jazz Band's "Cute" into precise elegance while Duke Heitger's "Rhythm is Our Business" bursts with joyful energy. The program culminates in Lokin, Him J, DJ SuenNam, and Hoini's hip-hop finale, where Tismé's "Yug's House Hop" and La Fougue's "Robbery" command the stage with contemporary brilliance.

Tonight's program—spanning classical refinement to urban vitality—creates a vibrant artistic conversation. May this shared experience move you as deeply as it inspires our performers. The lights dim...let the magic begin.

Biography



Huang Naiwei Guest Lecturer

Huang Naiwei is one of the most promising pianists in Hong Kong. His improvisational playing was highly praised by renowned cellist Yo-Yo Ma, who described him as an "impressive talent." The legendary Chinese piano maestro Liu Shikun also commended him as one of

the few pianists today who can improvise across various musical styles.

Huang has performed solo concerts and delivered masterclasses throughout Asia and Europe. He has collaborated with orchestras such as the Hong Kong Philharmonic Orchestra, the Guangzhou Symphony Orchestra, and the Hong Kong City Chamber Orchestra, as well as with conductors like Tan Dun, Leung Kin-fung, and Zhangzhen. He has also been invited to perform at numerous festivals including the Mozart 260th Anniversary series, the Shanghai Spring International Music Festival, the Shenzhen International Piano Festival and Art Basel. Additionally, he has served as a judge in various competitions. He now works as a teacher and external examiner at several institutions, as well as a council member of the Greater Bay Area Art Education Association.

Natalie Ho

Alumni of HKU SPACE Community College

Natalie Ho is a Hong Kong singer and one of the members of the girl band STRAYZ. Prior to her music career, Natalie studied at HKU SPACE, where she pursued a course in Media, Cultural, and Creative Studies to further enrich her artistic expression. She



first gained public attention in 2021 by participating in ViuTV's talent show Good Night Show - King Maker IV. Her musical talent and stage charisma quickly made her a favourite among young audiences.

In 2022, Natalie joined the girl band STRAYZ with other contestants, marking her official entry into the music industry. The group rapidly gained popularity with their unique musical style and vibrant performances.

In 2023, she released her first personal single "Time to Fly" followed by singles such as "Guardian Angel" "Byebye Byebye Byebye Byebye..." and "The 10001th Reunion" showcasing her versatility and depth in music creation.

Ma Wai Him

Ma Wai Him is the principal suona and guan player for the Hong Kong Chinese Orchestra, and is renowned for his mastery of various Chinese wind instruments. He learned from his father and earned a Master's degree with a double major in suona and guan at The Hong Kong Academy for Performing Arts, studying under several esteemed teachers. Ma has received numerous accolades, including the China National Arts Fund and the Young Artist Award (Music) at the Hong Kong Arts Development Awards. He gained recognition at the Osaka International Music Competition and serves as a Visiting Artist at his alma mater. His recent performances, including soloist roles and programme coordination, have gained critical acclaim. Ma also explores music composition and has collaborated with pop artists, and released his first music video single, La Mémoire, in 2020.

Ron Ng

Teacher of Functional Guitar Skills in Clinical Music Therapy Practice

Ron Ng is a graduate of the Hong Kong Academy for Performing Arts, holding a degree in music composition. With over 18 years of guitar experience, he specialises in jazz music and has studied under renowned guitarists such as Tommy Ho and Eugene Pao. To further enhance his skills, he attended master classes with international jazz artists. Ron has extensive performance experience, collaborating with various ensembles, including guitar duos and jazz quartets, and has performed at prestigious venues like the Fringe Club and the Four Seasons Hotel. He teaches jazz improvisation at the Hong Kong Academy for Performing Arts and has received multiple scholarships for his work. As a member of CASH, he composed Cantilena of No-mind for the Wuji Ensemble, showcasing his diverse musical style.





Vinc Chan

Vinc Chan graduated as a bass performance major from the Los Angeles Music Academy and is the bassist and composer of his own jazz project under his name, as well as the Fair Oaks Group and formerly the Happy Go Lucky Big Band. Vinc has been actively performing in local venues like the Laubak Livehouse, the Fringe Club, the Foreign Correspondents Club, Chez Trente, and the Aftermath. He has appeared in a variety of TV and radio programmes, as well as major performances such as the Freespace Jazz Fest, the HK Summer Jazz Big Band Era Festival, the Freespace Mixtape Production, Jazz Up Kowloon, the Next to Normal Musical, Les Miserables Musical, the Hypersonic Music Festival, and the Silvermine Bay Music Festival. In addition to performing in different venues in the area, Chan is also the music director for various universities and organisations.
